- 3. Read the following quote by Ellen Davis, biblical scholar at Duke Divinity on Job:

"What God says, in effect, is this: 'Look away from yourself, Job; look around you. For a moment see the world with my eyes, in all its intricacy and wild beauty. The beauty is in the wildness, Job; you cannot tame all that frightens you without losing the beauty.' God calls this man of integrity to take his place in a ravishing but dangerous world where only those who relinquish their personal expectations can live in peace. The price of peace is the surrender of our personal expectations, which are always too small for the huge freedom built into the system. The great question that God's speech out of the whirlwind poses for Job and every other person of integrity is this: Can you love what you do not control?"

- d. What, in creation, do you see as repulsive or non-essential (like the Ted Talk's vulture?) How do you think God sees that creature?
- e. What would it look like for us to show more humility when it comes to our relationship with Creation?
- f. How is such humility taught in our Christian faith?
