The Word Read: Philippians 2:1-13

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. WORSHIP SCHEDULE CHANGES OCTOBER 18

The Session has approved a return to in-person worship with modifications. NC's trends are steady, Guilford County's hospitalizations are down, and doctors know much more about treatment.

This has been a trying and often lonely time, and we are excited at the thought of being together again in the Sanctuary!

The Livestream service will move to 9 am. You can watch the recording at any time afterward. An in-person service with up to 100 worshipers will begin at 11 am. Look for more information in your mailbox and **on this page.**

Many staff and members have been planning to make worship together safe and meaningful. You are the most important piece of this: If you are in a high-risk category, or have symptoms, or have been exposed to someone with the virus, please keep yourself and others safe by staying home and worshiping via the Livestream. Remember the believers in Acts, who "spent much time together in the temple" and "broke bread at home ... with glad and generous hearts."

We will try this schedule until mid-December, calling on our Spirit-fruit of patience as we learn and make changes.

- Elders are chosen by the people: Together with the ministers of the Word and Sacrament, they exercise leadership, government, and discipline, and have responsibilities for the life of a particular church, as well as the Church at large, including Ecumenical relationships. (Book of Order)
- Elders should be persons of faith, dedication, and good judgment: Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian gospel both with the Church and in the world. (Book of Order)
- Church involvement: Persons who have invested themselves actively in the life and ministry of our church through worship, stewardship, service, teaching, caregiving, outreach and missions, work with children and youth, music ministry and or/committee and administrative work. Persons who are committed to Presbyterian forms of governance.
- Personal characteristics and skills: Persons who are cooperative, willing to learn, open to new ideas, dependable, and motivated.
- Trustees for the Richardson Trust: Current responsibility is the investment and disbursement of the L. Richardson Trust.
