

NEW TESTAMENT READING: Mark 9:14-27

When they came to the disciples, they saw a great crowd around them, and some scribes arguing with them. When the whole crowd saw him, they were immediately overcome with awe, and they ran forward to greet him. He asked them, "What are you arguing about with them?" Someone from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought you my son; he has a spirit that makes him unable to speak; and whenever it seizes him, it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, but they could not do so." He answered them, "You faithless generation, how much longer must I be among you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him. When the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. Jesus asked the father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. It has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you are able to do anything, have pity on us and help us." Jesus said to him, "If you are able! —All things can be done for the one who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out. "I believe; help my unbelief!" When Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saving to it, "You spirit that keeps this boy from speaking and hearing, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again!" After crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he was able to stand.

A LITANY OF GIFTSErnie Thompson

Leader: As in one body we have many parts and each part has its own

function, so all of us together with Christ are one body, and we all

belong to each other.

People: We have different gifts according to the grace God has given us.

Leader: If your gift is to hear God's Word,

People: speak it out in faith.

Leader: If your gift is service, **People:** live to serve others.

Leader: If your gift is the heart of a teacher,

People: teach what is true.

Leader: Let preachers preach with conviction, and givers give freely;

People: let officers work diligently for the people,

and let those who serve the poor, serve gladly.

Leader: Let us not lack for enthusiasm, but be ardent in spirit,

People: serving the Lord, rejoicing in hope, patient in suffering,

constant in prayer, supporting one another, and welcoming all.

Leader: The mission of God in Christ gives shape and substance to the life and work of the Church.

In Christ, the Church participates in God's mission for the transformation of creation and humanity by proclaiming to all people the good news of God's love, offering to all people the grace of God at font and table, and calling all people to discipleship in Christ.

Human beings have no higher goal in life than to glorify and enjoy God now and forever, living in covenant fellowship with God and participating in God's mission. Today we reclaim our historic calling and remember the great ends of the church:

All: The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind; the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God; the maintenance of divine worship; the preservation of the truth; the promotion of social righteousness; and the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

Leader: The ministry of the church is shared by pastor and people, so that all together may fulfill the mission to which we are called in Jesus Christ.

The particular responsibility of the ministry of a teaching elder is to build up the church and serve the people of God, so that the Word may be rightly proclaimed and the sacraments rightly celebrated.

The call to this ministry has been extended by the congregation, accepted by the candidate, and approved by the presbytery.

Therefore Salem Presbytery, by means of this commission, now installs Jill Duffield as pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Greensboro.

In her baptism, Jill was clothed with Christ.

She was ordained as a minister of Word and Sacrament
by Charlotte Presbytery and is now called by God through
the voice of the church to serve as pastor of this congregation.

All: We remember with joy our common calling to serve Christ, and we celebrate God's call to our sibling to serve among us as pastor.

CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTIONS

Leader: Do you trust in the Lord Jesus Christ your Savior,

acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church,

and through him believe in one God,

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Leader: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the

Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those

confessions as you lead the people of God?

Jill: I do and I will.

Leader: Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ,

under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided

by our confessions?

Jill: I will.

Leader: Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide

by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's

Word and Spirit?

Jill: I will.

Leader: Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love

your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Jill: I will.

Leader: Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Jill: I do.

Leader: Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy,

intelligence, imagination, and love?

Jill: I will.

Leader: Will you be a faithful teaching elder, proclaiming the good news

in Word and Sacrament, teaching faith and caring for people? Will you be active in government and discipline, serving in the councils of the church; and in your ministry will you try to show

the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Jill: I will.

Leader: Do we, the members of the church, accept Jill as our pastor

chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to guide

us in the way of Jesus Christ?

People: We do.

Leader: Do we agree to pray for her, encourage her, to respect her

decisions, and to follow as she guides us, serving Jesus Christ

who alone is Head of the Church?

People: We do.

Leader: Do we promise to pay her fairly and provide for her welfare as

she works among us; to stand by her in trouble and share her joys? Will we listen to the word she preaches, welcome her pastoral care, and honor her authority as she seeks to honor and

obey Jesus Christ our Lord?

People: We do and we will.

Leader: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Leader: We praise you, gracious Lord, for you alone are God. You have

made us, and we are your people, the sheep of your pasture. You have led us to green meadows by cool waters, satisfying our every need with your love. You have shown us paths that are right. Through shadowed valleys of despair, you have been our comfort and our hope. Over long generations, your presence has sustained your people. In your good time, you sent Jesus, your only Beloved, to be our shepherd. He knew and loved your own, calling all who

would hear to follow him. The Good Shepherd laid down his life for

us, risking the cross for the hope of resurrection. By the power of the risen Christ you gathered the church together to live for you in newness of life, a holy nation, a priestly family, a people chosen as your own and called to proclaim your marvelous love. Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us, that we may be faithful as your people and fruitful in the ministries you have given us. Grant diligence to those who lead, faith to those who teach, truth to all who speak, compassion to all who heal, wisdom to those who counsel, generosity to those who give, and cheerfulness to all who serve. To your servant Jill, and to all who tend your flock as pastors among your people, give vision and strength, hospitality, humility, and peace. Bless the common ministry of this pastor and people with joy and power in the gospel. Strengthen us to live out the grace of our baptism and to serve you with the gifts of your Holy Spirit; for the sake of Jesus Christ, our only shepherd and Lord.

bear witness to the crucified and risen Christ.


