SERVICE OF LIGHT: GATHERING

* Gathering Around the Fire

* Greeting

Leader: Grace and peace from Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: And also with you.

* Greeting and Introduction

Beloved people of God, on this most holy night when our Savior Jesus Christ passed from death to life, we gather with the church throughout the world in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through light and the word, through water, bread, and wine, we proclaim Christ's death and resurrection, we share Christ's triumph over sin and death, and we await Christ's coming again in glory.

Leader: In the beginning was the Word, **People: and the Word was with God,**

And the Word was God.

Leader: The life of Christ is the light of all people.

People: The light shines in the darkness,

And the darkness will not overcome it.

* Opening Prayer

Eternal God, in Jesus Christ you have given the light of life to all the world. Bless the new fire, and kindle in us the desire to shine with the brightness of Christ's rising, until we feast at the banquet of eternal light; through the Sun of Righteousness, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Lord be with you. And al-so-with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Leader: It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, the unseen God, the all-powerful Creator, and your only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. For Christ has ransomed us with his blood, and paid for us the debt of Adam's sin.

Leader: This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers. This is the night when you first saved our forebears: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery, and led them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when the pillar of fire destroyed the darkness of sin! This is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness. This is the night when Jesus broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave.

SCRIPTURE SENTENCES

Leader: Just as the body is one and has many members,

and all the members of the body, though many,

are one body, so it is with Christ.

People: In the one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

We are the body of Christ,

and individually members of it.

Profession of Faith

Leader: Beloved people of God,

through baptism we are washed clean from sin and made one as members of Christ's body.

By the mystery of Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection, the power of sin was broken and God's realm entered our world.

In baptism we become citizens of God's new creation, forever set free from the bondage of sin and death.

Tonight we celebrate our freedom and redemption

through the renewal of the promises made at our baptism.

I ask all of you, therefore, to reject sin, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, and to confess the faith of the church, the faith in which we are baptized.

The congregation is invited to rise in body or spirit.

* Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

People: I renounce them.

Leader: Who is your Lord and Savior?

People: Jesus Christ is my Lord and Savior.

Leader: Will you be Christ's faithful disciple,

obeying Christ's word and showing Christ's love?

People: I will, with God's help.

Leader: With the whole church, let us confess our faith:

Do you believe in God?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Leader: Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the Virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried;

he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Leader: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Leader: The Lord be with you. **People: And also with you.**

May all who now pass through these waters be delivered from death to life, from bondage to freedom, from sin to righteousness. Bind them to the household of faith and guard them from all evil. Strengthen them to serve you with joy until the day you make all things new. Through the Lord Jesus Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, we bless you, God of glory, now and forever. Amen.

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth,

in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

People: We lift them to the Lord.


Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give our thanks and praise.


Leader: Blessed are you, O Lord, our God.




Leader: Blessed is Jesus Christ, our Savior.
