First Presbyterian Church Session Meeting Monday, June 12, 2023

A session meeting of First Presbyterian Church (Greensboro) convened on Monday, June 12, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. in the Mullin Life Center. Rev. Dr. Jill Duffield, Senior Pastor, served as moderator. There were 41 Elders in attendance and three excused absences. In addition to Rev. Dr. Duffield, attendees included Rev. Newton Cowan and Rev. Matt Bussell, Director of Worship Anne Albert, Director of Christian Formation Donna Chase, Director of Property and Operations Tim Millisor, Sid and Cathy Batts Pastoral Resident Rev. Rachel Fitch, and incoming new members Katie and Rich Mack and their daughter Everett.

Welcome

Rev. Dr. Jill Duffield opened the meeting with Psalm 89:1-2, 5-6 and a prayer.

Consent Agenda

A motion was made, seconded and approved with no objections to accept the Consent Agenda:

Discipleship

Rev. Newton Cowan presented for new membership Katie and Mack Rich (accompanied by their young daughter Everett) from Raleigh by letter of transfer from First Presbyterian Raleigh. A motion was made, seconded and approved.

Pastoral Care

Rev. Newton Cowan presented a motion:

Per the declaration of the Sadye Bowles Fund, the Pastoral Care Committee moves that Frank Johns be named a member of the Sadye Bowles Ministry Team, to a 5-year term, beginning on September 1, 2023. The Pastoral Care Committee also moves that Betsy Farmer and Karen Rinehart be named to a second 5-year term as members of the Sayde Bowles Ministry Team beginning on September 1, 2023.

The motion passed unanimously.

Finance Reports

Finance Chair Chuck Norman announced that staff and the Finance Committee is delighted that Christine Ciaccio will return to her previous position as Director of Finance on Monday, June 12. He recognized and thanked Patty Pope for fulfilling the interim role in Christine's absence.

Mr. Norman reviewed the May 2023 Session Summary Financial Report [attached]. Revenues totaled \$2,343,000, which is \$235,000 higher than the same period last year and \$564,000 better than projected. Expenses are \$1,865,000, which is \$223,000 higher than last year, and \$64,000 more than projected. As noted last month, we have spent the approved expenses from the Greene Street property sale, and this month added \$53,000 for the chimney cleaning and repairs; the carpet replacement in the Life Center remains to be completed. The current balance is \$359,000, which will be lower after the carpet project.

The eight bullet points on the Statement of Operating Activities [attached] explain the variances in the budget. In summary, our net operating position at the end of May was positive by \$479,000. The operating balance is \$660,000 reflected on the Statement of Financial Position [attached], which is very healthy for this time in the budget cycle. Mr. Norman noted that he will return for one more report in August before he rotates off Session.

Feasibility Study

Stewardship Committee Chair Ralph Davison presented what we have learned through the interviews and surveys. He noted that these studies have "science to it but also art." There were 7 questions asked during 19 interviews and 3,000 emails sent to members. Most people didn't respond, with 254 responding out of 3,000.

In a quick summary of responses:

- How long at FPC: most respondents were members for more than 20 years
- Who have we not heard from: the newer members
- Age range: most respondents were over 65 (188), and the age group that least responded were 22 to 49 (23)
- Agree with the future vision: 277 yes, 5 no
- Rate importance of accomplishing the components of the funding priorities: most think all are important, housing was least important (doesn't affect us day in and day out)
- What's important, less so: All were important 80-90%, but low-income housing rated only 14%
- Do you feel that the right leadership is in place: 243 said the ministry and staff are the right leaders; 6 people said we do not
- Lay leadership: 213 felt leadership does well; 12, not as well. Lay leadership is also not well known.
- Are members adequately informed: Yes
- How much are we willing to give: If we did nothing else, but sent a postcard, we could raise \$5.5 million \$7 million, but we're looking for more. Could get above \$11 million if a good campaign is implemented.

Building relationships must happen. Mr. Davison believes true happiness results from bringing together our greatest values, passions and joy and bringing them together for the world's greatest need.

Session Size Task Force

The task force members Ginger Booker, Katherine Farless, and Sam Turner presented to Session. Task force member Anne Brown was absent due to sickness and Sam Simpson was absent due to his son's graduation. Turner reviewed the background [attached]. The issue was raised in January 2023 with a call from the Nominating Committee, then having trouble recruiting leadership. Whether to reduce the size of Session will be a decision made by Session members who are chosen to discern and guide. The task force researched new and better models of governance. Their research suggests that when Session is smaller, more responsibility is put on the Elders. Elders were asked to envision themselves as the Light of Christ. Pastors from comparable-sized churches in Richmond, Charlotte, and Dallas were interviewed. "Nimble" has been used most often as a descriptor of a smaller Session. A concern was raised as to whether the proposed change had been discussed with the capital campaign consultant. A lengthy discussion ensued.

The following motion was brought to Session at the May meeting, therefore the options are: table the motion, vote it up or down, or offer amendment.

Motion to elect a Session of 15 members with a transition to be implemented over the next 3 years, starting with a class of 5 new elders slated to begin next year.

An amendment was offered and seconded to elect a Session of 30. By a show of hands, the amended motion was defeated with 15 voting in favor, and 36 voting against.

Appointments Chair Martha Turner reminded the Session that the aspirant profile of each Class of Elders is of equal gender with representatives from three age-groups and that an odd number would make that balance an impossibility.

An amendment was offered and seconded to elect a Session of 18 members with a transition to be implemented over the next three years, starting with a class of 6 new elders slated to begin next year.

By a show of hands, the motion passed with 38 voting in favor, and 3 opposed.

There was discussion that communicating this change with the congregation will be important.

Scripture Reading

Elder Jeff Hatcher read Acts 16:23-33.

Faith Sharing

Elder Chip Permar shared his Faith Journey.

Prayers of the People

Rev. Newton Cowan shared that Leslie Deaton has been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer and for us to keep her in our prayers. He said to pray for our church staff, program staff, and pastors

as many are going through challenges. Celebrate graduation with Youth Elders Macy McAlister and Sidney Hunt. Rev. Rachel Fitch's son Isaac Fitch will be baptized by her pastor father at FPC.

Rev. Cowan offered Prayers of the People.

Outreach

Elder Anne Hurd reported on the Salem Presbytery Meeting on May 16. Of 250 Presbytery-wide who signed up to attend, FPC was represented by 13 people including pastors Duffield, Cowan, Fitch and incoming pastor Matt Bussell.

We heard two sermons and many reports including from the Presbyterian Foundation, Peace & Justice about Matthew 25 initiative, Hunger Task Force, an initiative to convert old weapons into garden tools, a request for dissolution of 2 churches, and approval of the proposed amendments, which mostly involved changes to wording.

The highlights were Charlie Younce presenting Rev. Newton Cowan for Acceptance of Call as our new Associate Pastor of Pastoral Care; and Gerard Davidson presented Rev. Matt Bussell to be welcomed into Salem Presbytery as our new Associate Pastor of Mission and Outreach.

Margaret Arbuckle received on behalf of FPC a check for \$1,000 to help underwrite a documentary film exploring and reconciling racism in our church's history. Others attending from FPC were: Rhonda Wakefield, Sam Turner, Nancy Abrams, Frank Johns, Betsy Harrington, and Anne Hurd and there were others who attended on ZOOM. She encouraged those attending in the future to ride-share as a good opportunity to build relationships.

New Business

Moderator Duffield announced New Business for the Good of the Session:

- Rev. Newton Cowan's installation will take place on July 30

There being no further business, Moderator Duffield offered a closing prayer and adjourned the meeting at 7:38 p.m.

Lunsford Richardson Trust Report to Session of First Presbyterian Church June 2023

Purpose of the Trust

Over a century ago, Mr. Lunsford Richardson established and funded the L. Richardson Trust. The purpose of the Trust: the "profits or dividends arising therefrom shall be used by the said Trustees for the benefit of Home and Foreign Missions and the benevolent causes of the church, in such proportion as the Trustees deem best..."

Administration

The administration of the Trust, including any distributions made by the Trust and a prudent accumulation of assets in the Trust over time, is the responsibility of its Board of Trustees. The nominating committee of First Presbyterian Church nominates one new Trustee each year, and the congregation elects that person to serve a five-year term. The Chair position rotates to the individual in his/her last year as a Trustee. The Trustees serving in 2023 are Lisa Anderson, Chair, Alex Maultsby, Jim Hegner, Graham Farless, and Carole Lesley.

Investment Management

The Trust funds are managed by Oppenheimer & Co., led by the team of Hugh Williams (member of FPC), Wes Watson and Tony Monforton. Oppenheimer & Co. and this team of advisors have been involved with the Trust for several years.

Investment Objective

The overall investment objective of the Trust is to achieve a total return through asset appreciation and income to preserve and grow the value of the Trust. In doing so, the Trust can best meet its charitable mission and make annual distributions, while minimizing the volatility and impact to the portfolio during periods of financial market distress.

Value and Annual Allocation

On December 31, 2022, the estimated market value of the portfolio was \$1,183,985.00. Based on the policy adopted in 2012, the spendable amount each year should not exceed 5% of the 3 year (12 month) moving average of the portfolio market value which is \$1,284,402.00.

Distribution Decision Procedure

Typically, the trustees make distribution decisions and award grants in April each year based on the assets in the trust as of December 31st of the previous year. The Trustees began accepting grant applications in February 2023 with a deadline for applications of March 15, 2023. Each

Trustee received all grant requests in advance of the scheduled meeting for distribution decisions. At the time of the meeting, the Trustees had had the opportunity to read each grant request and participated in a full discussion regarding each grant. Decisions made were weighed carefully, in keeping with Mr. Richardson's expressed wishes.

2023 Distributions

In 2023, the trustees considered the stock and bond market conditions as well as the trust's overall performance and agreed to allocate 3.97% of the 3 year (12 month) moving average of the portfolio market value (rather than 5%) which amounted to \$51,000. After discussing the thirteen grant proposals received, the following allocations were agreed upon:

The fruit of the spirit is faithfulness. Ed served in the Korean War and as leader of his sons' Boy Scout troop. In his professional career he was an accountant and construction company owner.

The fruit of the spirit is gentleness. Never one to express anger with his grandchildren, he often reached out to them for help, especially with technology.

The fruit of the spirit is self control. Ed channeled his boundless energy to helping others.

In his letter to the Colossians, Paul says: "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds us all together in perfect harmony. And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts. For as members of one body you are called to live in peace. And always be thankful."

Ed was clothed in the love of God, and he gave love and received love his whole life long.

Revenues actually exceeded Expenses by \$300,124 which was better than we expected through June 30, 2023 by \$477,354. Revenues were \$590,946 above expected for the current period and \$216,908 above the same period in the prior year. The monthly budget is based on historical trends and estimates rather than using a simple average per month. For the 6 months ending June 30, 2023, we expected Expenses to exceed Revenues by \$177,230.

Non-Pledge Gifts are \$13,344 less than we expected in the current period and \$11,355 less than received last year. Plate Offerings are \$4,430 more than we expected in the current period and \$3,892 more than received last year. Pledge Gifts are \$365,850 more than we expected and are \$153,452 more than the same period last year. Pledges and Gifts represent the majority of our Revenue. First Presbyterian Church Explanations of Significant Variances from Year to Date Budget As of June 30, 2023

- Contributions and Gifts are \$385,873 over budget mainly due to pledged giving. Pledged gifts were \$366k over budget and \$153k above the same period in the prior year.
- Restricted gifts funds support is over budget by \$123,063 mainly due to the repairs and replacement in property that includes the cemetary, chimney and the carpet installation. These are offset by the actual expenses in the respective department.
- Repairs are \$88,179 over budget mainly due hvac repairs, carpet replacement and refill of the hot water storage. Some of these expenses have been funded from the property restricted fund.

First Presbyterian Church Explanations of Significant Variances from Year to Date Budget As of July 31, 2023

- Contributions and Gifts are \$408,021 over budget mainly due to pledged giving. Pledged gifts were \$360k over budget and \$219k above the same period in the prior year.
- Restricted gifts funds support is over budget by \$156,571 mainly due to the repairs and replacement in property that includes the cemetary, chimney, heat pump, stair treads, and carpet installation. These are offset by the actual expenses in the respective department.
- Repairs are \$111,596 over budget mainly due hvac repairs, carpet, heat pump, stair treads replacements and refill of the hot water storage. Some of these expenses have been funded from the property restricted fund.



Quick History of the use, study, and plans for the Shetler Building

- The Shetler building and adjoining parking was built in the 50s by the Beard family and was a bank central office for years.
- First Presbyterian Church bought the Shetler building in the 1990s, built the Life Center to attach to the building (There is no finished wall on the Life Center that is attached to the Shetler Building.
- During the time of Pastor Shetler, the staff was moved to office in this building from offices in the Smith Building.
- After the completion of the renovated Smith and Sanctuary in 2014, the staff was
 moved to offices in the Smith building and the main Sanctuaries building's first
 floor in early 2015. This was pastor Sid Batts desire to have the staff where all
 main church functions happened.
- In 2017, the Property Committee signed a listing agreement with Vince Howard of Brown Investment Properties advertise, show to interested parties the availability to rent or sell the Shetler Building Offers to be presented to the Session and Congregation if received). No offers were received to purchase the building. There were a few rent options that would require massive renovation of the building with a price tag of @ \$750,000. A presentation to the combined Property and Finance committees resulted in no interest in pursuing this option.
- In 2018, Pastor Sid Batts appointed a Session ad hoc committee chaired by Betsy Farmer to study the various uses of the Shetler Building and recommend to Session a course of action. The committee reported back that the best use of the property would be to keep the parking deck and tear down Shetler to build a park.
- In 2019, Pastor Sid Batts appointed an ad hoc committee chaired by Vic Cochran
 to study the plans and the costs involved in tearing down the Shetler building and
 building the park. This was reported back to Session as costing @\$750,000. No
 approval was given for this project due to lack of funding.
- 2021, The Property Committee signed a listing agreement with Beau McIntosh to
 put out a call for offers for the sale of church properties across Greene Street and
 the Shetler Building. An offer was received, approved by the Session and
 Congregation to sell the properties across Greene Street (closing happened in
 February of 2023). One exceptionally low offer to purchase the Shetler Building
 and was deemed not credible by the Property Committee.
- The Shetler building has been shown to prospective buyers several additional times in 2021, 2022 and 2023.
- IN 2022, THE Session approved FPC to join a Duke Divinity led COHORT group of several churches to discern the best use and funding of the Shetler Building.
