Being a witness to each other

Noticed, named and known. These three words sum up what's required for people to have a sense of belonging.

This insight comes from research done on the epidemic of isolation and loneliness among teenagers and young adults. The Springtide Research Institute gleaned important, but sobering data, regarding how alone many youth and young adults feel. As an example, 39% agreed they had NOBODY to talk to.

Fuller Youth Institute did additional research in this field specifically for youth connected to a religious community and while the data revealed some positive connections between faith and mental health, there were many areas of concern. The data revealed that about a third of those surveyed felt anonymous or invisible at their place of worship. A little less than that percentage said no one spoke to them when they attended church. Couple these findings with Springtide's insight that what most contributed to a young person's sense of belonging and overall mental health was a relationship with at least one trusted adult.

The report concluded:

What emerged as we conducted our interviews was the idea that creating a sense of belonging is actually a three-step process. We call this process being Noticed, Named, and Known.

Young people told us that first they need to be seen and acknowledged, then they need to be understood and counted on, before finally being integrated into the daily life of the group. Our respondents told us that when they feel Noticed, Named, and Known a sense of belonging naturally emerges.

I would argue that this is true for all generations. We all need to be noticed, named and known in order to belong. One youth leader at Fuller Youth Institute said that being seen is equated with being loved. In other words, we need a witness, a trusted witness who sees rightly who we are, values us as we are, and is excited about being with us.

This Lent we're exploring the theme "Be a Witness" using the lectionary texts appointed for each Sunday. We will bear witness to the painful and the beautiful, the challenging and the uplifting. In all of it we will seek to bear witness to the love of God as we notice, name and know our Savior and in so doing, see Christ in one another.

My prayer as that this Lent will be a season where we commit to noticing, naming and knowing everyone we encounter so we can be a witness to how the Spirit is moving in them, in us, and in the world.

Hi First Pres! I am learning so much at PCUSA's Mission to the United Nations. Did you know we are one of the founding nonprofit groups at the UN? It's remarkable to see the significant but often unknown work our denomination does to make the world a better place for all of God's people. I focus on creation care and climate policy as well as migration, gender justice, peace in the Korean peninsula, and human rights in Myanmar and Cameroon.

I didn't realize how big a role our denomination plays in both New York and Washington, DC, working

We also attend UN gatherings on topics such as biodiversity and the status of women.
