# WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

THE WORD READ: Philippians 2:1-13 ......Reece Medlin

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

THE WORD READ: Exodus 17:1-7

From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. The people guarreled with Moses, and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you guarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?" But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?" So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." The LORD said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink." Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. Congregation: Thanks be to God.





#### **IN MEMORIAM**

Anne Elizabeth Penn Adams September 26, 1933 – May 20, 2023

Anne Adams lived a rich, full, and beautiful life that expressed the love she had for Christ and his church, and for her family, her friends, her work, and her community.

Anne's love of family began in Danville Va, where she was born and raised. Her time at St. Mary's Junior College was cut short when her Aunt Mae died and Anne returned to Danville to help her uncle raise his two sons. She then became a flight attendant for Eastern Airlines, based in Miami, where she met her husband Harry Adams. Their loving marriage led not only to two special and adored daughters – and over time – to grandchildren and their friends and pets that became part of Anne's family. With great aplomb, Anne even served as the flower girl in one of her granddaughter's wedding.

Anne and Harry extended their love from family to their work. After marrying, they moved to Greensboro and founded Adams Antiques. They loved what they did – the travel, the search for perfect pieces, and the camaraderie of the friends who often joined them on their trips. Anne must have loved hearing "Oh! I love it!" when one of those perfect pieces caught the eye of a visitor to the shop.

Friends, church, and community also received a lot of love from Anne. A member of First Presbyterian for over 60 years, she served on numerous committees and projects and was elected to Session. She contributed to community life through her volunteer work for Bonterre Garden Club, the Junior League of Greensboro, and Hospice.

Anne was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Harry and her sister, Mary Lee Penn Arthur. She is survived by her daughters, Beth Adams Gallagher and her husband Brian and Julie Adams Hartsell. "Mama Anne" will be lovingly remembered by her five grandchildren: Liza Moore Kane and her husband, Mike; Clifton Wesley Moore, III; Elizabeth Chappell Upper and her husband Joey; Gabriel Penn Hartsell; and William Worth Hartsell.

In Anne's long life, she was a daughter, a sibling, a niece, wife, mother, grandmother, businesswoman, volunteer, friend, and elder. But above all, she was a daughter of the church, known and loved beyond measure by God as his child.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church remembers with appreciation the life and service of Anne Adams. It requests that a copy of this memorial be placed in its minutes and a copy sent to her family.
