IN MEMORIAM

Thomas Richard Beard
October 2, 1932—September 21, 2023

"Life is short, and we do not have much time to gladden the hearts of those who make the journey with us. So, be swift to love and make haste to be kind, and the blessings of God who made us, who loves us and who travels with us, be with us now and forever."

- Christ School blessing

Tom Beard was a devoted servant leader, an industrious businessman, a loving husband to Nancy for 65 years and a cherished father, grandfather and great-grandfather. His favorite hobby was people; he never met a stranger.

A Greensboro native, Tom was baptized at First Presbyterian Church in 1933 by Dr. Charles Myers. Over many years he faithfully served the church as a deacon and an elder. He took great pleasure lending his tenor voice to the choir for more than three decades. The Beard family donated the limestone floor in the chancel of the sanctuary, enhancing both beauty and sound.

Tom was a generous supporter of Christ School in Arden, N.C., where he attended high school and which he credits for developing his love of music and work ethic. He served many years on the school's Board of Trustees. He was a proud Davidson College graduate who served in the U.S. Army in France and was honorably discharged.

Returning home from the Army, he joined his father in the hardwood lumber business and created one of the most respected hardwood lumber wholesale companies in the world and a top U.S. exporter to Asia. He was a pioneer in introducing Tulip Poplar to the export market in the late 1970s.

Tom loved Greensboro and was committed to helping make it a better place for generations to come, giving back to his hometown in his service through community organizations including the Kiwanis Club and Presbyterian Homes, Inc.

Like many other people, Tom had difficulties, living with Crohn's Disease for more than 40 years, losing both parents 10 days apart and being predeceased by all three of his brothers, but through it all his faith sustained him.

In a letter to church confirmands in 1978, Tom wrote, in part: "Life is not meant to be easy ... With the help of Christianity and your friends, you will find your goals easier to fulfill with love, joy and success ... Make Christ the center of your life."

That was wonderful advice for young people from one who practiced what he preached.

The Session gives thanks to God for Tom's life and offers its deepest condolences to his family and friends. It requests that a copy of this memorial be placed in its minutes and a copy sent to his family.
